(Notes)

- Only count professionals who are serving at the medical clinic as their primary duty.
 (Do not include staff of adjoining facilities such as a nursing home.)
- 2) Consider those who fully serve weekly working hours decided by the medical institution (prescribed working hours) as "full-time" and those who do not as "parttime" regardless of the type of employment.
- 3) Use the following formula to calculate full-time equivalent and fill out the relevant fields.

 Round off to the first decimal place.

 Enter "0.1" in the first decimal place, if the result has a fraction less than 0.1.

 Do not omit the "0" of numbers like "0.1" or "1.0" when providing full-time equivalent.

Full-time	Actual working hours of health professionals per week (excluding overtime)
equivalent =	Weekly regular working hours (prescribed working hours) of full- time workers set by the medical care institution

* Use 32 hours as the denominator if the weekly regular working hours are less than 32 hours.

4) "28 Childcare workers" only applies to childcare workers who serve child patients. Do not include childcare workers who are employed at in-hospital childcare facilities.
