

Report on Public Health Administration and Services FY2013

【Digest of Summary Report】

< Pharmaceutical Affairs >

- The number of pharmacies was 57,071, an increase of 1,274 (2.3%) on the previous fiscal year .
- The number of pharmacies per 100,000 population was 44.8 nationwide, and by prefecture, the largest number was 62.9 of Saga prefecture followed by Yamaguchi prefecture at 58.2 and Hiroshima prefecture at 57.3.

< Maternal protection >

- The total number of legal abortion was 186,253, a decrease of 10,386 (5.3%) on the previous fiscal year .
- The legal abortion rate (per 1,000 female population of age 15-49) was 7.0.

Outline of Report on Public Health Administration and Services

1 Objective

Reports on Public Health Administration and Services is to perceive the actual situation of administration of sanitation in each prefecture, designated city, and core city under laws and orders related to sanitation, in order to gain basic data for administrative management of sanitation.

2 Subjects

Prefectures, designated cities, and core cities

3 Types of Report

Yearly Report (47 tables) and Biennial Report (11 tables)

4 Report Items

Items related to mental health and welfare, nutrition, sanitary inspection, environmental health, food sanitation, veterinary sanitation, medical monitoring, pharmaceutical affairs, maternal protection, specified diseases (intractable diseases), and rabies control

5 Method and Route of Report

(1) The Prefectural governor, Mayor of designated cities and core cities reported to Director-General Statistics and Information Department, Minister's Secretariat, Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare (MHLW) by the deadline.

(2) Route of Report

MHLW — Prefectures, designated cities, and core cities
