Outline of Survey Results

1 Estimated Number of Patients (per day)

The estimated number of patients who received medical treatment nationwide (Except for Ishinomaki medical area and Kesennuma medical area of Miyagi prefecture, and Fukushima prefecture) on the dates of survey were 1,341.0 thousand "inpatients" and 7,260.5 thousand "outpatients".

(1) Estimated number of patients (per day) by type of medical institution, sex and age group

Viewing the 1,341.0 thousand of the estimated number of "inpatients" by type of medical care institution, 1,290.1 thousand inpatients were in "hospitals" and 50.9 thousand inpatients were in "general clinics". By sex, 613.6 thousand inpatients were "male" and 727.5 thousand inpatients were "female". By age group, 914.9 thousand inpatients were "65 years or older" and 661.6 thousand inpatients were "75 years or older". Viewing the 7,260.5 thousand of outpatients by type of medical care institution, 1,659.2 thousand patients visited "hospitals", 4,238.8 thousand patients visited "general clinics", and 1,362.5 thousand patients visited "dental clinics". By sex, 3,062.5 thousand patients were "male" and 4,198.0 thousand patients were "female". By age group, 3,329.9 thousand patients were "65 years or older" and 1,829.9 thousand patients were "75 years or older". (Table 1)

(2) Estimated number of patients (per day) by disease and injury

a. Inpatients

Viewing the estimated number of inpatients, the classifications of diseases from the largest to the smallest in estimated number of inpatients are "V Mental and behavioural disorders" (282.3 thousand), "IX Diseases of the circulatory system" (251.3 thousand), "II Neoplasms" (150.6 thousand).

The classifications of diseases from the largest to the smallest in estimated number of hospital inpatients are "V Mental and behavioural disorders" (280.6 thousand), "IX Diseases of the circulatory system" (241.6 thousand), and "II Neoplasms" (147.8 thousand). The classifications of diseases from the largest to the smallest in number of general clinic inpatients are "IX Diseases of the circulatory system" (9.6 thousand), "XIX Injury, poisoning and certain other consequences of external causes" (6.7 thousand), and "XIII Diseases of the musculoskeletal system and connective tissue" (5.0 thousand). b Outpatients

In estimated number of outpatients by classification of diseases, the classifications of diseases from the largest to the smallest in number of outpatients are "XI Diseases of the digestive system" (1,300.3 thousand), "XIII Diseases of the musculoskeletal system and connective tissue" (1,001.8 thousand), and "IX Diseases of the circulatory system" (948.3 thousand).

The classifications of diseases from the largest to the smallest in number of hospital outpatients are "IX Diseases of the circulatory system" (250.7 thousand), "XIII Diseases of the musculoskeletal system and connective tissue" (189.3 thousand), and "II Neoplasms" (177.0 thousand). The classifications of diseases from the largest to the smallest in number of general clinic outpatients are "XIII Diseases of the musculoskeletal system and connective tissue" (812.5 thousand), "IX Diseases of the circulatory system" (697.6 thousand), and "X Diseases of the respiratory system" (606.2 thousand) (Table 3).

(3) Estimated number of patients (per day) by type of bed

Viewing the estimated number of inpatient by type of bed, in hospitals, 293.4 thousand are in "psychiatric beds", 286.6 thousand are in "beds for long-term care", 707.2 thousand are in "general beds". In general clinics, 12.7 thousand are in "bed for long-term care".

When this number is viewed by classification of disease, major categories in hospital general beds are "II Neoplasms" with 138.7 thousand patients and "IX Diseases of the circulatory system" with 114.5 thousands patient, and in hospital beds for long-term care, "IX Diseases of the circulatory system" with 125.8 thousand patients and "VI Diseases of the nervous system" with 35.5 thousand patients (Table 4).

(4) Home medical care

(Unit: Thousand)

The estimated number of outpatients who received home medical care on the date of survey is 110.7 thousand. By medical care institution, 15.3 thousand patients received home medical care by "hospitals", 78.9 thousand by "general clinics", and 16.5 thousand by "dental clinics".

By type of home medical care in total, 35.7 thousand received "on-call visit", 67.2 thousand received "home visit consultation", and 7.8 thousand received "home visit by person other than physicians or dentists". (Table 5)

(5) Circumstances at the time of visit

Viewing the circumstances at the time of visit, the estimated number of patients that made an emergency visit was 270.3 thousand persons (or 20.2% of the total number of inpatients) for "inpatients", and 45.7 thousand (or 0.8% of the total number of outpatients) for "outpatients".

In a breakdown by type of institution, amongst inpatients, it was 263.4 thousand persons for "hospital", 6.9 thousand for "general clinic", and their proportion to the total was 20.4% and 13.6% respectively. Amongst outpatients, it was 37.1 thousand persons for "hospital", 8.6 thousand for "general clinic", and their proportion to the total was 2.2% and 0.2% respectively.

In a breakdown by status of emergency visits, the estimated number of patients that were transported by an ambulance was 138.6 thousand persons (or 51.3% of emergency visiting inpatients) for "inpatients", and 15.3 thousand (or 33.4 % of emergency visiting outpatients) for "outpatients". (Table 6)



(6) Severity

In detail on hospitalization (severity and other circumstances) in percentage, 5.8% is "life-threatening", 73.8% is "small risk of life but requiring inpatient treatment", 13.5% is "to be discharged when acceptance condition is met", and 1.1% is "hospitalization for examination". Patients who are "to be discharged when acceptance condition is met" increase as the age group becomes older. (Figure 1).
