Overview

1 Objectives

This longitudinal, statistical survey follows the same subjects over a long period, and has been conducted since the Fiscal Year 2001. The purpose of this survey is to obtain basic data for planning and implementing various policy measures, including countermeasures against the falling birthrate, designated by the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare, through monitoring the status of babies born in the first year of the 21st century, and changes affecting this status over the years.

2 Scope

This survey is targeted at babies, including each sibling of twins and triplets, who were born in Japan during the periods between January 10 - 17 and July 10 - 17, 2001. The Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare sampled the survey subjects based on the Vital Statistics Data.

3 Dates of the Survey

The survey was conducted on January 18, 2008 for infants born in January, and on July 18, 2008 for those born in July (The age of the infants: 84 months old).

(i.e. In the 1st through 6th surveys, the survey was conducted on August 1 for infants born in January, and on February 1 for those born in July.)

4 Contents of the Survey

Family members living together, the employment status of the parents, relationship with grandparents and neighbors, wakeup time and bedtime, children's status after school, lessons etc., hours spent watching TV, hours spent playing computer games, illnesses and injuries, hours spent with children, burdens and worries about child rearing, concerns and worries in children's daily life, child-rearing expenditures etc.

5 Method of the Survey

The questionnaires were delivered and collected by post.
