3 Fetal and perinatal mortality

(1) Fetal deaths by employment status of mother and occupation when there was a fetal death

Fetal death rates (per 1,000 total births) by employment status/occupation of mother in FY2020 stood at 19.3 for employed and at 17.1 for non-employed.

As for fetal death rates (per 1,000 total births) by occupation in FY2020, the rate was high for "Carrying, cleaning, packaging, and related workers" at 44.6, and low for "Professional and engineering workers" at 13.6. (Table 8)

(2) Perinatal deaths by employment status/occupation of mother at the time of fetal deaths or live births

Perinatal death rates (per 1,000 total births) by employment status/occupation of mother in FY2020 stood at 3.1 for employed and at 2.8 for non-employed.

Perinatal death rates (per 1,000 total births) by occupation in FY2020 ranged from 2.3 to 3.8, with all occupations showing similar levels of perinatal deaths. (Table 9)
