To Press and those who may concern,

Restriction of distribution of Yuzu produced in parts of Fukushima Prefecture, and Cancellation of Instruction to restrict distribution of Tea leaf produced in parts of Kanagawa Prefecture, in relation to the accident at Tokyo Electric Power Company (TEPCO)'s Fukushima Nuclear Power Plant

- As of 4 August 2011, the Nuclear Emergency Response Headquarters announced revisions to the “Concepts of Inspection Planning and the Establishment and Cancellation of Items and Areas to which Restriction of Distribution and/or Consumption of Foods concerned Applies” concerning radioactive materials in foods.
- Based on the policy and the results of inspections conducted until yesterday and in the lights of the Nuclear Safety Commission’s advice, the Nuclear Emergency Response Headquarters has issued to restrict the distribution of Yuzu produced in parts of Fukushima prefecture for Governor of the Fukushima Prefecture.
- Also based on the Act on Special Measures Concerning Nuclear Emergency Preparedness, Director-General of the Nuclear Emergency Response Headquarters has cancelled its Instruction of restriction of distribution of Tea leaf produced in Minamishigara-shi for Governor of Kanagawa Prefecture.

1. With regard to Fukushima prefecture, the restriction of distribution of Yuzu produced in Fukushima-shi and Minamisoma-shi was instructed today.
 - (1) The Instruction of the Nuclear Emergency Response Headquarters is attached as attachment 1.
 - (2) The concept of management at Fukushima Prefecture after ordering the restriction of distribution is attached as attachment 2.
2. With regard to Kanagawa prefecture, the restriction of distribution of Tea leaf produced in Minamishigara-shi instructed on June 2, 23 and 27 was cancelled today.
 - (3) The Instruction of the Nuclear Emergency Response Headquarters is attached as attachment 3.
 - (4) The application of Kanagawa Prefecture is attached as attachment 4.

Instruction

From Director-General of the Nuclear Emergency Response Headquarters
To Governor of Fukushima Prefecture,

The Instruction to the Prefecture on August 25 2011 based on the Article 20.3 of the Act on Special Measures Concerning Nuclear Emergency Preparedness (Act No. 156, 1999) shall be changed as follows.

1. Restrictive requirements shall apply to heads of relevant municipalities, food business operators concerned and residents not to consume and distribute any non-head type leafy vegetables produced in Tamura-shi (limiting area within 20 km radius from the TEPCO's Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant), Minamisoma-shi (limiting area within 20 km radius from the TEPCO's Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant and Planned Evacuation Zones), Kawamata-machi (limiting Yamakiya area), Hirono-machi, Naraha-machi, Tomioka-machi, Okuma-machi, Futaba-machi, Namie-machi, Kawauchi-mura, Katsurao-mura and Iitate-mura, for the time being.
2. Restrictive requirements shall apply to heads of relevant municipalities, food business operators concerned and residents not to consume and distribute any head type leafy vegetables produced in Tamura-shi (limiting area within 20 km radius from the TEPCO's Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant), Minamisoma-shi (limiting area within 20 km radius from the TEPCO's Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant and Planned Evacuation Zones), Kawamata-machi (limiting Yamakiya area), Hirono-machi, Naraha-machi, Tomioka-machi, Okuma-machi, Futaba-machi, Namie-machi, Kawauchi-mura, Katsurao-mura and Iitate-mura, for the time being.
3. Restrictive requirements shall apply to heads of relevant municipalities, food business operators concerned and residents not to consume and distribute any flowerhead brassicas produced in Tamura-shi (limiting area within 20 km radius from the TEPCO's Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant), Minamisoma-shi (limiting area within 20 km radius from the TEPCO's Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant and Planned Evacuation Zones), Kawamata-machi (limiting Yamakiya area), Hirono-machi, Naraha-machi, Tomioka-machi, Okuma-machi, Futaba-machi, Namie-machi, Kawauchi-mura, Katsurao-mura and Iitate-mura, for the time being.
4. Restrictive requirements shall apply to heads of relevant municipalities and food business operators concerned not to distribute any Turnips produced in Tamura-shi (limiting area within 20 km radius from the TEPCO's Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant), Minamisoma-shi (limiting area within 20 km radius from the TEPCO's Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant and Planned Evocation Zone), Kawamata-machi (limiting Yamakiya area), Hirono-machi, Naraha-machi, Tomioka-machi, Okuma-machi, Futaba-machi, Namie-machi, Kawauchi-mura, Katsurao-mura and Iitate-mura, for the time being.
5. Restrictive requirements shall apply to heads of relevant municipalities and food business operators concerned not to distribute any Umes produced in Fukushima-shi Date-shi, Soma-shi, Minamisoma-shi and Kori-machi, for the time being.
6. Restrictive requirements shall apply to heads of relevant municipalities and food business

operators concerned not to distribute any Yuzus produced in Fukushima-shi and Minamisoma-shi, for the time being.

7. Restrictive requirements shall apply to heads of relevant municipalities and food business operators concerned not to distribute raw milk produced in the Prefecture, except for that produced in Fukushima-shi, Nihonmatsu-shi, Date-shi, Motomiya-shi, Koriyama-shi, Sukagawa-shi, Tamura-shi (excluding area within 20 km radius from the TEPCO's Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant), Shirakawa-shi, Kitakata-shi, Souma-shi, Minamisouma-shi (excluding area within 20 km radius from the TEPCO's Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant and Planned Evacuation Zone), Iwaki-shi, Kunimi-machi, Kawamata-machi (excluding Yamakiya area), Kagamiishi-machi, Ishikawa-machi, Asakawa-machi, Furudono-machi, Miharu-machi, Ono-machi, Yabuki-machi, Yamatsuri-machi, Hanawa-machi, Bandai-machi, Inawashiro-machi, Mishima-machi, Aizumisato-machi, Shimogo-machi, Minamiaizu-machi, Shinchi-machi, Otama-mura, Hirata-mura, Nishigo-mura, Izumisaki-mura, Nakajima-mura, Samekawa-mura and Kawauchi-mura (excluding area within 20 km radius from the TEPCO's Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant) for the time being.
8. Restrictive requirements shall apply to heads of relevant municipalities, food business operators concerned and residents not to consume any log-grown Shiitakes (outdoor cultivation) produced in Iitate-mura for the time being.
9. Restrictive requirements shall apply to heads of relevant municipalities and food business operators concerned not to distribute any log-grown Shiitakes (outdoor cultivation) produced in Fukushima-shi, Date-shi, Motomiya-shi, Souma-shi, Minamisouma-shi, Tamura-shi (limiting area within 20 km radius from the TEPCO's Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant), Kawamata-machi, Namie-machi, Futaba-machi, Okuma-machi, Tomioka-machi, Naraha-machi, Hirono-machi, Iitate-mura, Katsurao-mura and Kawauchi-mura (limiting area within 20 km radius from the TEPCO's Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant) for the time being.
10. Restrictive requirements shall apply to heads of relevant municipalities and food business operators concerned not to distribute any log-grown Shiitakes (hothouse cultivation) produced in Date-shi, Motomiya-shi and Shinchi-machi for the time being.
11. Restrictive requirements shall apply to heads of relevant municipalities and food business operators concerned not to distribute any Bamboo shoots produced in Date-shi, Soma-shi, Minamisoma-shi, Motomiya-shi, Kori-machi, Kawamata-machi, Miharu-machi and Nishigo-mura for the time being.
12. Restrictive requirements shall apply to heads of relevant municipalities and food business operators concerned not to distribute any Ostrich ferns produced in Fukushima-shi and Kori-machi.
13. Restrictive requirements shall apply to food business operators concerned and residents not to distribute and consume any Juvenile sand lances for the time being landed at Fukushima prefecture.
14. Restrictive requirements shall apply to food business operators concerned not to distribute any Cherry salmons (excluding farmed fish) captured in Akimoto Lake, Hibara Lake, Onogawa Lake and rivers flowing into these Lakes, Nagase River (limiting upper reaches from the junction with Su River), Abukuma River (including its branches but limiting inside Fukushima prefecture) and Mano river (including its branches) for the time being.
15. Restrictive requirements shall apply to food business operators concerned not to distribute any Japanese dace captured in Mano river (including its branches) and Abukuma River (limiting lower reaches from Shinobu Dam but including its branches) for the time being.
16. Restrictive requirements shall apply to food business operators concerned not to distribute any Ayu (excluding farmed fish) captured in Abukuma River (limiting lower reaches from Shinobu Dam but including its branches), Mano River (including its branches) and Niida River (including its

branches) for the time being.

17. Restrictive requirements shall apply to food business operators concerned not to move any Cattle (excluding under 12-month old) farmed in the prefecture to outside of the prefecture and not to ship any Cattle farmed in the prefecture to slaughterhouses for the time being, provided, however, that this shall not apply to Cattle which are managed based on shipment and inspection policy set by Fukushima prefecture.

The Instruction to the Prefecture on June 27 2011 based on the Article 20.3 of the Act on Special Measures Concerning Nuclear Emergency Preparedness (Act No. 156, 1999) shall be changed as follows.

Restrictive requirement shall apply to heads of relevant municipalities and food business operators concerned not to distribute any tea leaves produced in Sagami-hara-shi, Odawara-shi, Nakai-machi, Matsuda-machi, Yamakita-machi, Aikawa-machi, Manazuru-machi, Yugawara-machi and Kiyokawa-mura for the time being.
