To Press and those who may concern,

Restriction of distribution of foods based on the Act on Special Measures Concerning Nuclear Emergency Preparedness, direction of Director-General of the Nuclear Emergency Response Headquarters

Today, based on the results of inspections conducted until yesterday and in the lights of the Nuclear Safety Commission's advice, the Nuclear Emergency Response Headquarters has issued restriction of distribution of Pacific cod captured in the Pacific Ocean, Aomori offshore for Governor of Aomori.

- 1. With regard to Aomori prefecture, the restriction of distribution of Pacific cod captured in the Pacific Ocean, Aomori offshore is instructed today.
  - (1) The Instruction of the Nuclear Emergency Response Headquarters is attached as attachment 1.
  - (2) The concept of management at Aomori prefecture after ordering the restriction of distribution is attached as attachment 2.
- The list of Instructions on the restriction of distribution and/or consumption of food concerned in accordance with the Act on Special Measures Concerning Nuclear Emergency Preparedness is attached as reference.

## Instruction

27 August 2012

From Director-General of the Nuclear Emergency Response Headquarters To Governor of Fukushima Prefecture,

Recognizing the accident occurred at the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Plant operated by TEPCO, the following order shall take place, under the authority of the Director-General of the Nuclear Emergency Response Headquarters, following Article 20.3 of the Act on Special Measures Concerning Nuclear Emergency Preparedness (Act No. 156, 1999):

Restrictive requirements shall apply to food business operators concerned not to distribute any Pacific cod captured in the Pacific Ocean, Aomori offshore for the time being.
