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Figure 1: Annual changes in the number of households under protection, number of beneficiaries of livelihood protection, and public assistance ratio




Figure 2: Annual changes in the number of households receiving livelihood protection, categorized by duration of protection

Thousand households




Figure 3: Annual changes in the number of beneficiaries receiving livelihood protection, categorized by age group





Figure 4: Changes in average lifespan and future estimates
