
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#### Overview

- Population in 2019: 96.2 million (2019)
- Area: 331,236 km<sup>2</sup> (2018)
- 7 ecological zones, 63 provinces, 713 districts, 11,162 communes (2018)
- GDP/capita: US\$ 2,587 (2018)
- 54 ethnic minorities
- Life expectancy: 73.6 years old men: 70 and women: 75 (2018)
- Persons aged 60 and above: 11.8 million (2018)




## Entering the stage of population aging in 2011



#### Health status of elderly

- 50% of the elderly reported bad or very bad health conditions
- 95% of the elderly suffering from sickness, mainly chronic and non-communicable diseases
  - arthritis (34.3%)
  - high blood pressure (more than 47%)
  - heart related diseases (16.5%)
  - lung diseases (17.6 %)
  - digestive problems (27.1%)
- 63% of the elderly suffering from weak eyesight without supportive facilities

### Remaining issues

Traditional care of the family to the elderly is decreasing, increasing in number of the elderly

- live alone
- live with their spouse (also the elderly)
- live in a skipped-generation family

#### The living standard of the elderly is low in general:

- live in temporary houses
- work hardly especially in difficult regions and ethnic minority
- live without pension, saving money or any stable income

# Expectation LIVE IN JOY, HEALTH AND USEFULNESS

- By 2025
  - 80% of elderly have regular health checkups at least once a year with health monitoring and management record;
  - 90% of elderly get accessing to health care services in case of illness
  - 100% of elderly have health insurance cards

- By 2030
  - Population: 104 million
  - Life expectancy: ~75
  - Healthy life expectancy: ~68



#### Priority Issues

Further improve the legal framework

Promote private sector to take a part in service providing

Diversify care models in more effective and professional way

Focus on capacity building for staff with social work

Strengthen M&E system in policy implementation

Increase cooperation, sharing experience and mobilize resources
