Community General Support Center

The Community General Support Center is a facility, established by municipalities and staffed with public health nurses, social workers, chief long-term care support specialists, and other experts, to comprehensively support local residents by providing necessary assistance for the residents to maintain their health and have stable livelihood. (Long-Term Care Insurance Act, Article 115-46, Paragraph 1)


