Summary of the Survey

I The 15th Longitudinal Survey of Newborns in the 21st Century (2001 Cohort)

1 Objective

This statistical survey has been conducted since 2001 as a longitudinal survey to track the same survey objects over a number of years. The purpose of the survey is to capture information instrumental for the planning, formation and implementation of necessary MHLW measures such as measures for combating Japan's declining birth rate and the sound upbringing of children through the continuous observation of the actual situations and changes over years of children who were born in the first year of the 21st century.

2 Subjects of the survey

The Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare sampled survey objects based on the birth questionnaire of its demographic survey, targeting children from all over Japan, who were born between January 10 and 17, 2001 and between July 10 and 17, 2001. This survey also covers twins and triplets.

The age of the children at the time of the 15th survey was 15 years old (ninth grader).

3 Survey period

The survey was conducted on January 18, 2016 for those born in January, and on July 18, 2016 for those born in July.

(Reference: The 1st to 6th surveys were conducted on August 1 for those born in January, and February 1 for those born in July.)

4 Items surveyed

Guardians: ···· Labour force statuses of parents, educational/career paths that guardians hope their children to follow, child-rearing perceptions, child-rearing costs, etc.

Children: Family situations, own future (e.g. educational/career path, marriage), worries and anxieties, etc.

5 Survey method and result tabulation

Questionnaires were distributed and collected by mail.

The survey results were tabulated by the Director-General for Statistics and Information Policy, Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare.

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II The 6th Longitudinal Survey of Newborns in the 21st Century (2010 Cohort)

1 Objective

This statistical survey is conducted as a longitudinal survey to track the same survey objects over a number of years. The purpose of the survey is to capture information instrumental for the planning, formation and implementation of necessary measures such as measures for combating Japan's declining birth rate through the continuous observation of the actual situations and changes over years of children who were born in 2010 as well as its comparison and contract with another survey that continuously observes children who were born in 2001, or the first year of the 21st century.

2 Subjects of the survey

The Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare sampled survey objects based on the birth questionnaire of its demographic survey, targeting children from all over Japan, who were born between May 10 and 24, 2010. This survey also covers twins and triplets.

The age of the children at the time of the 6th survey was 5 years and 6 months old.

3 Survey period

The survey was conducted on December 1, 2015.

4 Items surveyed

Labour force statuses of parents, family situations, living conditions of children, child-rearing perceptions, use of childcare services, child-rearing costs, etc.

5 Survey method and result tabulation

Questionnaires were distributed and collected by mail.

The survey results were tabulated by the Director-General for Statistics and Information Policy, Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare.
