4 Marriages

The trends of marriages, by employment status and occupation of bride and groom before living together, are as follows.

(1) Marriages by employment status of bride and groom, and by first marriage or remarriage

The number of marriages in FY 2005 by employment status of groom, stood at 660,661 for employed and at 26,207 for non-employed. As for marriages entered and registered in FY 2005 (i.e. except couples who started living together in FY 2004 or earlier), the proportions by age group at the time of starting to live together and by first marriage or remarriage, the rates of non-employed grooms in "15 - 19 years" and "50 years and over" are more than twice as high as those in other age groups, for both first marriages and remarriages.

The number of marriages in FY 2005 by employment status of bride, stood at 454,131 for employed and at 229,908 for non-employed. As for marriages entered and registered in FY 2005, the proportions of by age group at the time of starting to live together and by first marriage or remarriage, the rates of non-employed brides are higher than employed brides in "15 - 19 years" and "50 years and over" for first marriages, while the rates of non-employed brides are higher than employed brides in "15 - 19 years", "20 - 24 years" and "50 years and over" for remarriages.

Marriages rates (per 1,000 population) of grooms by employment status in FY 2005 stood at 18.7 for employed, and at 1.7 for non-employed. Those of brides stood at 17.9 for employed, and at 7.8 for non-employed. As for marriages entered and registered in FY 2005 by age group at the time of starting to live together and by first marriage or remarriage, the rates of employed grooms are high in all age groups for both first marriages and remarriages, while dispersion exists between age groups of brides, for both first marriages and remarriages.

(2) Mean age of marriages by employment status and occupation of bride and groom

In FY 2005, mean age of marriages (age at the time of starting to live together), by employment status of bride and groom, stood at 31.6 years for employed grooms, and at 37.0 years for non-employed grooms; and at 29.5 years for employed brides, and at 29.2 years for non-employed brides.

Mean age of first marriages stood at 29.9 years for employed grooms, and at 28.0 years for non-employed grooms; and at 28.4 years for employed brides, and at 27.2 years for non-employed brides.

Mean age of first marriages by occupation of groom was low at 28.8 years in "Service work" and "Security work", and high at 35.0 years in "Management" and 31.0 years in "Clerical work".

Mean age of first marriages by occupation of bride was low at 27.3 years in "Service work" and "Security work", and high at 31.6 years in "Management" and 29.1 years in "Clerical work".

(3) Age difference between bride and groom, by employment status and occupation of bride and groom

As for age difference between bride and groom at the time of starting to live together in FY 2005, the proportions by employment status of bride and groom, 23.6% of employed grooms had elder brides, and 59.8% had younger brides; while 25.6% of non-employed grooms had elder brides, and 58.7% had younger brides.

Of employed brides, 25.1% had younger grooms, and 57.5% had elder grooms; while 20.9% of non-employed brides had younger grooms, and 64.1% had elder grooms.

By occupation of groom, the rate of elder bride is high in "Security work" at 27.3%, and low in "Management" at 12.7%.

By occupation of bride, the rate of younger groom was high in "Transport and communications" at 29.6%, and low in "Agriculture, forestry and fisheries" at 19.7%.

(4) Marriages by employment status and by occupation of bride and groom

As for the proportions of marriages by employment status of bride and groom in FY 2005, 67.0% of employed grooms had employed brides, and 32.0% had non-employed brides. Of employed brides, 97.5% had employed grooms, and 2.2% had non-employed grooms.

On the other hand, 38.0% of non-employed grooms had employed brides, and 61.1% had non-employed brides. Of non-employed brides, 92.0% had employed grooms, and 7.0% had non-employed grooms.
