## 2. General Mortality

The status of deaths, except those of persons aged below 15, by employment status, occupation and industry at the time of death, is as follows.

## (1) Mortality by employment status and sex

Of total 1,215,772 deaths in FY 2010, 122,791 were employed, and 992,974 were non-employed (total number of deaths was 1,069,209, of which 134,641 were employed and 851,755 were non-employed in the previous survey in FY 2005).

Of 641,816 male deaths, 92,032 (14.3%) were employed, and 493,262 (76.9%) were non-employed (103,982 (18.0%) were employed and 424,736 (73.7%) were non-employed in the previous survey).

On the other hand, of total 573,956 female deaths, 30,759 (5.4%) were employed and 499,712 (87.1%) were non-employed (30,659 (6.2%) were employed and 427,019 (86.6%) were non-employed in the previous survey).

By sex and age group, the proportion of employed males is higher in "25 - 29 years" to "50 - 54 years", while that for non-employed males is higher in other age groups. That for non-employed females is higher in all age groups (Table 4).

Death rates (per 1,000 population) in FY 2010 by employment status stood at 11.1 in total, 2.1 for employed persons, and 22.6 for non-employed persons (9.8 in total, 2.2 for employed persons, and 19.2 for non-employed persons in the previous survey).

The death rates of males were 12.1 in total, 2.7 for employed, and 31.5 for non-employed.

On the contrary, those for females were 10.1 in total, 1.2 for employed, and 17.7 for non-employed.

By sex and age group, the death rates of non-employed persons are higher in almost all the age groups (Table 5).

## (2) Mortality by leading cause of death, by employment status and occupation

As for the proportions of leading causes of male deaths by employment status in FY 2010, "malignant neoplasms" was the largest for both employed (38.8%) and non-employed (32.0%) (38.6% for employed and 32.9% for non-employed in the previous survey).

By occupation, the percentage of "malignant neoplasms" was the highest in "Administrative and managerial workers" at 44.5%, and the lowest in "Security workers" at 31.4%.

For the causes of death, "malignant neoplasms" is followed by heart diseases, cerebrovascular diseases, suicide, and accidents in this order for employed males, and by heart diseases, pneumonia, cerebrovascular diseases, and accidents in this order for non-employed males (Table 6-1).

Subsequently, as for the proportions of leading causes of female deaths by employment status in FY 2010, "malignant neoplasms" was the largest for both employed (37.9%) and non-employed (23.8%) (38.3% for employed and 25.1% for non-employed in the previous survey).

By occupation, the percentage of "malignant neoplasms" was the highest in "Clerical workers" at 49.5%, and the lowest in "Agriculture, forestry and fishery workers" at 31.2%.

For the causes of death for both employed and non-employed females, "malignant neoplasms" is followed by heart diseases, cerebrovascular diseases and pneumonia in this order (Table 6-2).

## (3) Mortality by leading cause of death by industry

The proportions of leading causes of deaths for employed males by industry in FY 2010, "malignant neoplasms" was the highest in "Finance and insurance" at 44.2%, and the lowest in "Real estate and goods rental and leasing" at 34.9%.

"Heart diseases" was the highest in "Services, N.E.C." at 16.0%, and the lowest in "Finance and insurance" at 12.0%. "Cerebrovascular diseases" was the highest in "Services, N.E.C." at 9.9%, and the lowest in "Fisheries" and "Government, except elsewhere classified" at 7.2% (Table 7-1).

The proportions of leading causes of deaths for employed females by industry in FY 2010, "malignant neoplasms" was the highest in "Education, learning support" at 49.1%, and the lowest in "Real estate and goods rental and leasing" at 31.5%.

"Heart diseases" was the highest in "Real estate and goods rental and leasing" at 17.2%, and the lowest in "Government, except elsewhere classified" at 7.1%. "Cerebrovascular diseases" was the highest in "Accommodations, eating and drinking services" at 13.1%, and the lowest in "Electricity, gas, heat supply and water" at 7.5% (Table 7-2).
