# 4. Marriages

The trends of marriages, by employment status and occupation of bride and groom before living together, are as follows.

## (1) Marriages by employment status of bride and groom, and by first marriage or remarriage

The number of marriages in FY 2010 by employment status of groom, stood at 625,936 (91.6%) for employed and at 23,301 (3.4%) for non-employed (660,661 (91.4%) for employed and 26,207 (3.6%) for non-employed in the previous survey in FY 2005).

As for marriages entered and registered in FY 2010, the proportions by age group at the time of starting to live together, that for non-employed grooms in "60 - 64 years" and "65 years and over" are higher than those in other age groups, for both first marriages and remarriages (Table 10-1).

The number of marriages in FY 2010 by employment status of bride, stood at 475,114 (69.5%) for employed and at 173,479 (25.4%) for non-employed (454,131 (62.8%) for employed and 229,908 (31.8%) for non-employed in the previous survey).

As for marriages entered and registered in FY 2010, the proportions by age group at the time of starting to live together, that for non-employed brides are higher than employed brides in "15 - 19 years" and "60 years and over" for first marriages, while non-employed brides are higher than employed brides in "below 24 years" and "60 years and over" for remarriages (Table 10-2).

Marriage rates (per 1,000 population) of grooms by employment status in FY 2010 stood at 18.6 for employed, and at 1.5 for non-employed. Those of brides stood at 18.9 for employed and at 6.1 for non-employed (Marriage rates of grooms stood at 18.7 for employed and 1.7 for non-employed, and those of brides stood at 17.9 for employed and 7.8 for non-employed in the previous survey).

As for marriages entered and registered in FY 2010 by age group at the time of starting to live together and by first marriage or remarriage, the rates of employed grooms are higher in all age groups for both first marriages and remarriages, while the rates of employed brides are higher in most age groups for first marriages and dispersion exists between age groups of brides for remarriages (Table 11).

#### (2) Mean age of marriages by employment status and occupation of bride and groom

As for marriages entered and registered in FY 2010, mean age of marriages (age at the time of starting to live together), by employment status of bride and groom, stood at 32.3 years (previously 31.6 years) for employed grooms, and at 39.9 years (previously 37.0 years) for non-employed grooms; and at 30.3 years for both employed and non-employed brides (29.5 years for employed and 29.2 years for non-employed in the previous survey).

Mean age of first marriages stood at 30.6 years (previously 29.9 years) for employed grooms, and at 29.3 years (previously 28.0 years) for non-employed grooms; and at 29.2 years (previously 28.4 years) for employed brides, and at 27.8 years (previously 27.2 years) for non-employed brides.

Mean age of first marriages by occupation was low at 28.8 years for grooms and at 27.5 years for brides in "Security workers", and high at 35.4 years for grooms and at 32.2 years for brides in "Administrative and managerial workers" (Table 12).

# (3) Age difference between bride and groom, by employment status, occupation of bride and groom

As for age difference between bride and groom at the time of starting to live together for marriages entered and registered in FY 2010, the proportions by employment status of bride and groom, 24.0% (previously 23.6%) of employed grooms had elder brides, and 58.5% (previously 59.8%) had younger brides; while 24.7% (previously 25.6%) of non-employed grooms had elder brides, and 60.1% (previously 58.7%) had younger brides.

Of employed brides, 25.0% (previously 25.1%) had younger grooms, and 56.9% (previously 57.5%) had elder grooms; while 21.2% (previously 20.9%) of non-employed brides had younger grooms, and 63.1% (previously 64.1%) had elder grooms.

By occupation of groom, the proportion of elder bride is high in "Security workers" at 28.7%, and low in "Administrative and managerial workers" at 14.6%.

By occupation of bride, the proportion of younger groom was high in "Carrying, cleaning, packaging, and related workers" at 27.8%, and low in "Agriculture, forestry and fishery workers" at 21.5% (Table 13).

## (4) Marriages by employment status, occupation of bride and groom

As for the proportions of marriages by employment status of bride and groom in FY 2010, 67.9% (previously 61.2%) of employed grooms had employed brides, and 23.1% (previously 29.3%) of employed grooms had non-employed brides, and 2.0% (previously 2.2%) of non-employed brides had non-employed grooms, and 1.4% (previously 1.4%) of employed brides had non-employed grooms (Table 14).
