

Outline of the 10th Longitudinal Survey of Middle-aged and Elderly Persons

1. Objective

The Longitudinal Survey of Middle-aged and Elderly Persons collects data continuously from a nationally representative sample of middle-aged and elderly men and women who were 50-59 years old at the end of October in 2005. The survey gathers information on the sample's family situation, health status, and work status on an annual basis to help inform policy.

2. Subjects

The first wave of the survey targeted men and women nationwide who were 50-59 years old (as of end of October, 2005). The tenth survey surveyed those who participated in the eighth or the ninth wave of the survey. Subjects in the tenth survey were between 59 and 68 years old.

3. Survey Date

Survey cycle: Once a year (the first Wednesday of November)

Survey date: November 5 (Wed.), 2014 (tenth survey)

4. Survey Items

Family situation, health status, employment status, social activities, acquisition situation of a license or qualification, etc.

5. Survey Method

The Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare sent out questionnaires to the subjects by mail. The subjects filled out and returned the questionnaires to the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare by mail.
