# **Outline of Survey**

#### 1 Objective

This survey has been conducted since 2005 as the first year by tracking males and females in middle-aged and elderly generations from all over Japan, including the baby boom generation, through the continuous investigation of change processes in both their consciousness and facts through health, work and social activities, in order to understand correlations between behavioral changes and events, and to capture information instrumental for the planning, formation and implementation of necessary MHLW measures such as measures for the elderly.

#### 2 Scope of Survey and Households Surveyed

The survey objects were selected from males and females aged 50 to 59 as of the end of October 2005 nationwide, who also participated in the 10th or 11th survey.

The ages of the surveyed individuals at the time of the 12th survey were 61 to 70.

#### 3 Dates of the survey

Survey cycle:	Once a year (1st Wednesday of November)
Date of the 12th survey:	Wednesday, November 2, 2016

#### 4 Survey Items

Family situations, health conditions, labour force statuses, future life plans, social activities, etc.

#### 5 Survey method

Each surveyed individual filled out a questionnaire mailed by the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare, and then submitted it to the Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare by mail.
