Kampung Siaga Bencana (Disaster Preparedness Village) in Indonesia



Legal basis: (1) Law No. 24 of 2007 on Disaster Management: Strengthening Indonesia's Disaster Control Capability and Establishing National Program on Community Disaster Preparedness; (2) Law No. 11 of 2009 on Social Welfare, Article 1, Section 9: "Social Protection is all efforts aimed at preventing and addressing the risk of shocks and social vulnerability; (3) Minister of Social Affairs Decree No. 128 of 2011 on *Kampung Siaga Bencana*.

A Village (KSB/DPV) becomes disaster resilient when it is ...

Prepared for the inevitable natural hazards that are likely to occur at the wrong time and in the wrong place relative to the village's social constructs.

A Village (KSB/DPV) becomes disaster resilient when ...

1. Its people, buildings, infrastructure, essential and critical facilities are protected by codes, standards, etc. against the potential disaster agents of likely natural hazards.
2. It is able to: (a) respond **intelligently** in real time to move people out of harm's way, (b) meet their need in an emergency, and (c) restore the village's basic functions. Key Elements of Intelligent Emergency Response: Communication; Evacuation; Search and Rescue; Emergency Transportation; Local, Regional, and International Assistance.
3. It's policies not only enable it to resist disasters without failing, but also facilitates a quick, sustainable recovery after the emergency phase.



TAGANA Program in *Kampung Siaga Bencana*:

1. TAGANA Educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.
2. Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, TAGANA members can assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help. TAGANA members also are encouraged to support emergency response agencies by taking a more active role in emergency preparedness projects in their community.

1. Rapid Assessment and report to the post or service / social agencies.
2. Rescue victims from insecurity place to shelter.
3. To register victims of natural disasters with disaggregation.
4. Carry out the fulfillment of basic needs and psychosocial support.

TAGANA GOES TO SCHOOL: Education in every disaster response (+ preparedness)

1. Education can be life-saving and life-sustaining during disasters.
2. Education is a right, even in an emergency, and key to life with dignity.
3. Education is what children/parents ask for during disasters.
4. Quality, relevant education contributes to development, economic growth, peace, stability and good governance.
5. The next TAGANA Program is "TAGANA GOES TO FOREST" in response to the recent common 'smoke' disaster in the main islands of Sumatera and Kalimantan.

TAGANA Inter-Village Network for Education in Emergency

1. TAGANA delivers appropriate disaster prevention, mitigation, preparedness, risk reduction and response to build people's capacities and tackles the causes of vulnerability.
2. Local, regional, national, and international, open network: over 27,000 members in 33 Provinces of Indonesia.
3. Working voluntarily to ensure right to informal education and training in disasters and post-disaster recovery.
4. Facilitative role across villages and social organizations to strengthen knowledge base, build capacity.
5. Sharing information and creating good practices, lessons learned and tools, inter-village education and training, increasing collaboration.

TAGANA IN PRE-DISASTER PHASE:

1. Documenting and mapping of disaster-prone areas.
2. Increased capacity of communities in disaster risk reduction, especially in disaster prone areas.
3. Increased community preparedness for a potential disaster.
4. Facilitate the formation and development of the village disaster preparedness.
5. Early detection system to the public over the possibility of a disaster.
6. Evacuation together with concerned parties especially in the field of social protection for the affected communities.
