

Political Declaration of the High-level Meeting on Universal Health Coverage "Universal health coverage: moving together to build a healthier world"

We, Heads of State and Government and representatives of States and Governments, assembled at the United Nations on 23 September 2019, with a dedicated focus for the first time on universal health coverage, reaffirm that health is a precondition for and an outcome and indicator of the social, economic and environmental dimensions of sustainable development and the implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, and strongly recommit to achieve universal health coverage by 2030, with a view to scaling up the global effort to build a healthier world for all, and in this regard we:

- Reaffirm the right of every human being, without distinction of any kind, to the enjoyment of the highest attainable standard of physical and mental health;
- 2. Reaffirm General Assembly Resolution 70/1 of September 2015, entitled "Transforming our world: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development", stressing the need for a comprehensive and people-centered approach, with a view to leaving no one behind, reaching the furthest behind first, and the importance of health across all the goals and targets of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, which are integrated and indivisible;
- Reaffirm General Assembly Resolution 69/313 of 27 July 2015 on the Addis Ababa Action Agenda
 of the Third International Conference on Financing for Development, which reaffirmed strong
 political commitment to address the challenge of financing and creating an enabling environment at
 all levels for sustainable development in the spirit of global partnership and solidarity;






ASIAN Center for Active Ageing and Innovation

Progress of the realization towards UHC by AMS





Noted by the 38th and 39th ASEAN Summit in 2021


10 commitments under Regional Plan of Action

- 4. Mainstream ageing into public policies and national development plans, programmes
- 5. Promote the development of human capital


- Development of reliable, evidence-based, gender-disaggregated data on ageing

- 10. Build and strengthen networking and partnership within and among AMS, and with other partners




