# Outline of National Hansen's Disease Sanatorium, National Hospital Organization and National Centers for Advanced and Specialized Medical Care

### [National Hansen's Disease Sanatorium]

- (1) There are 2,568 people in 13 facilities of National Hansen's Disease Sanatorium nationwide (as of May 1, 2009)
- (2) National Hansen's Disease Sanatorium provide specialized medical care for Hansen's disease.

### [National Hospital Organization]

- (1) National Hospital Organization has 145 hospitals with 57,150 beds in Japan (as of April 1, 2009).
- (2) National Hospital Organization provides medical services, study/research and training for engineers to with regard to the diseases with a great impact on people's health and intractable diseases by using the policy medical network of the Agency.

### [National Center for Advanced and Specialized Medical Care]

- (1) National Centers for Advanced and Specialized Medical Care consist of 6 independent administrative institutions which are the non-government-official type organizations and were established by making the transition from National Advanced and Specialized Medical Center under the "Act on Independent Administrative Agencies where Researches of Advanced Specialized Medical Service are conducted" (Act. No. 93, of the year 2008).
- (2) National Centers for Advanced and Specialized Medical Care develop and disseminate an advanced and pioneering medical service, analyze the cause and symptom, develop and research on new diagnosis and treatment methods, train specialized medical professionals and provide information comprehensively and unitarily on the diseases with a great impact on people's health such as cancer, stroke and cardiac diseases.
- (3) National Centers for Advanced and Specialized Medical Care have 8 hospitals with 5,107 beds in Japan (as of April, 2010).
