Overview of Memorial Projects for War Dead
Recovery of the Remains of War Dead
Teams to collect the remains of Japanese war dead have been sent to former major battlefields since FY 1952.As of April 1, 2010, about 1,260,000 remains out of 2,400,000 war dead abroad (including those in Iwo Jima and Okinawa) have been collected. Collecting the remains, etc. in the former Soviet Union has been emphasized since FY 1992.
DNA analysis project on the Remains of War Dead Abroad
Since FY 2003, DNA analysis has been conducted at national expense upon the requests of the bereaved relative, under a certain condition such as the availability of the extraction of usable DNA, the existence of materials of the buried decedent, etc.
Pilgrimages for Memorial Services and Visits to Burial Sites
To conduct memorial services for the war dead in former major battlefields, in the sea and in other areas where the collection of remains is not possible, the national government has systematically conducted pilgrimages composed mainly of bereaved survivors since FY 1976.
Friendship and Goodwill Memorial Project
Since FY 1991, from the viewpoint that children of the war dead are also war victims, just as he people living in those areas that were the sites of major battlefields during the war, a friendship and goodwill memorial project has been carried out among those people. In these activities, memorial ceremonies are held for the war victims and the participants pledge their commitment to permanent peace.
Erection of Monuments to the War Dead

Since FY 1970, monuments to those who died in the war have been gradually erected at the site of former major battlefields.
