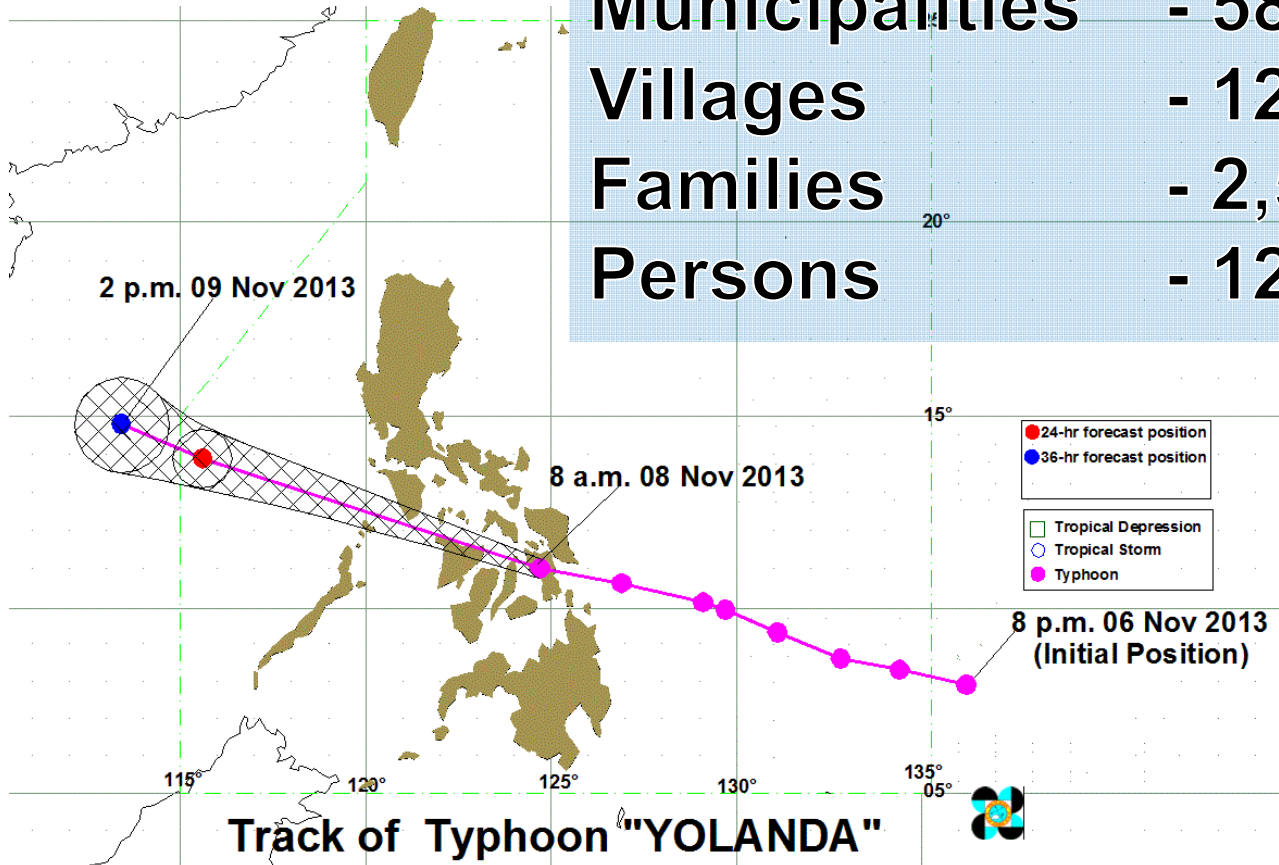

Typhoon Yolanda

- Typhoon Haiyan/Yolanda, was one of the strongest tropical cyclones ever recorded, devastating portions of Southeast Asia , particularly the Philippines, in November 2013
- On Nov 6, the Joint Typhoon Warning Center (JTWC) upgraded *HAIYAN* to a super typhoon which had maximum winds of 250 km/h.
- At 1100 November 7 the eye of Typhoon Yolanda was located 640 km. east of Hinatuan, Surigao Del Sur
- 1st land fall was at 0440 Friday, November 8 in Guiuan, Eastern Samar, 2nd was at 0700 Friday, November 8 in Tolosa, Leyte
- The typhoon made 4 additional landfalls as it traversed the Visayas: Daanbantayan, Bantayan Island, Concepcion, and Busuanga Island.
- The JTWC estimated the system's one-minute sustained winds to 315 km/h. Typhoon "Yolanda" exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) at 1400 Saturday, November 9.
