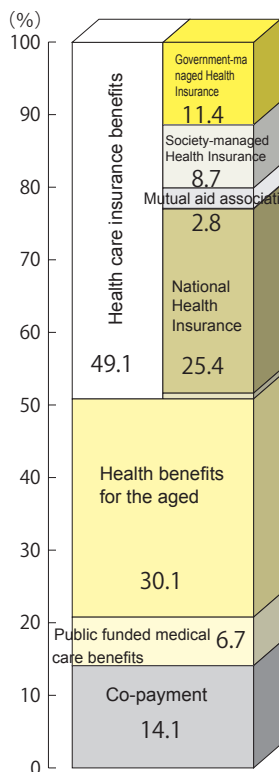

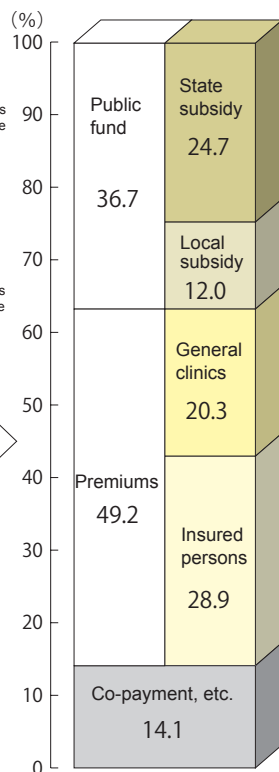
Structure of National Health Expenditure (FY 2007)

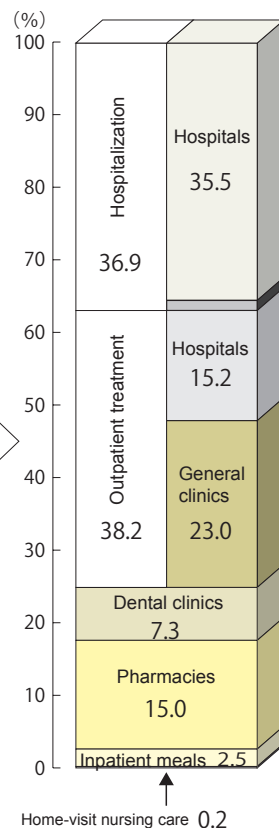
Breakdown of national health expenditure by systems



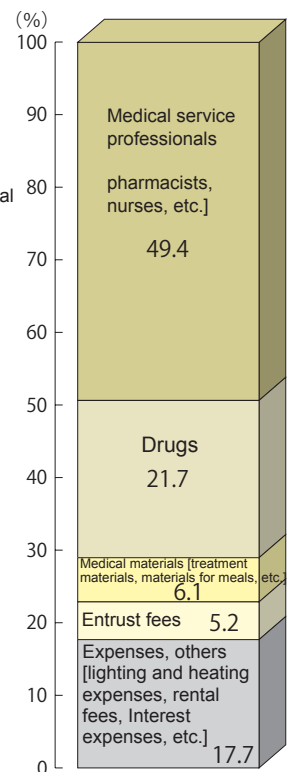
Payments of national health expenditure (by financial)
